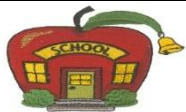

TK ORIENTATION / INTERDISTRICT TRANSFER DEADLINES & INFORMATION

If you have a child currently attending school in the Ross Valley School District, there is no need to re-register him/her. The following information pertains only to students who are not currently attending a school in the District. Please find below information regarding:

- **Interdistrict Enrollment:** From one California school district to another California school district.
Applicable only to families who are not residents of RVSD.

Transitional Kindergarten (TK) Orientation for the 2017-18 School Year

For the 2017-18 school year, a child must have his/her 5th birthday between September 2 and December 2, 2017 to be eligible to attend Transitional Kindergarten. The Transitional Kindergarten program is still under development for the 2017-18 school year as the eligibility of students will include 3 months of students (those who turn 5 between September 2 and December 2, 2017), and program implementation will depend on the number of students who enroll. Information on Transitional Kindergarten will be presented at a Transitional Kindergarten Orientation.

Interdistrict Attendance Application Period for 2017-18

- **March 1 – April 1** for any currently attending or new students TK-7th grades who do not reside within RVSD boundaries and wish to return for the 2017-18 school year (either a new or to renew an Interdistrict transfer)
- Or within 10 days of moving outside District boundaries after April 1

Flexible Learning Opportunities (FLO): Support the Parent/Support the Child

FLO (Flexible Learning Opportunities) is a Ross Valley School District based support group for parents who have children that are "unique" learners. Unique Learners show variations in areas such as giftedness, attention, memory, speech and language, auditory, visual, or sensory processing, organization, motor skills, behavior, and social skills. Founded in the spring of 2010, FLO was created to offer a variety of support, educational programming and resources to RVSD parents over the course of the school year. FLO believes that it takes a village to ensure our children's' academic and social success, where parents, teachers and administrators work collaboratively and communicate consistently. If students are to thrive, effective communication between parents and their children's' educational team needs to be the norm, not the exception. FLO will provide a parent forum several times a year in a private residence for families who: would

like to connect with other families who have children that receive services in the district; don't qualify for services, but feel that their child's needs aren't being met.
